Donations have been made to Red Cross

Foundation charities across Europe, both financial and supplies of protective equipment for hospitals.



Coming together with other sectors, companies

donated a total of one million euros to the Lombardy Region of Italy for the construction of a temporary hospital at the Milan Expo.



Hundreds of thousands of masks have been donated

to hospitals and associations across
Europe to protect key workers.



Over 600 thousand euros donations have been given to foodbanks across Europe and in the US where communities face food insecurity due to COVID-19.



Companies have ramped up production of handsanitiser gels and are making donations of sanitisers to local community efforts.



Supporting a hard-hit agriculture sector, stocks of tulips has been purchased in the Netherlands and donated to brighten up homes of people living in isolation.



Ethanol has been provided to local doctors for disinfectant use in some countries, and anti-inflammatory and anaesthetic products are being inventoried for potential supply to hospitals.



Health authorities have been granted access to biotechnology facilities and laboratories for coronavirus (PCR) testing, and are offered 3D printing facilities for the manufacture of respiratory masks.
